

Board of Supervisors, Palmyra Township, Pike County, July 7, 2020

CALL TO ORDER:

The July 7, 2020 meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Palmyra Township, Pike County, PA was called to order at 7:00 PM at the Township Building, Paupack, PA with the following members present: Simons, Ehrhardt and Coutts. Also present for the Township was Solicitor Waldron and Administrator Rose.

MINUTES/BILLS/RECEIPTS:

On motion by Mr. Coutts, seconded by Mr. Ehrhardt, and unanimously carried, the minutes of the June 16, 2020 meeting were approved. Bills in the amount of \$26,910.91 were approved for payment and receipts in the amount of \$13,811.20 were reported with a list of each on file.

PUBLIC:

PIKE COUNTY SECOND AMENDMENT SANCTUARY

Robert Roche and Patricia Coombs were in attendance representing the Pike County Second Amendment Sanctuary along with several residents in support of their efforts. They asked the Supervisors to consider adopting a resolution stating Palmyra Township would use no municipal authority nor funds to in any way compromise the rights of Palmyra Township residents regarding the Second Amendment to the Constitution. The Supervisors and Solicitor Waldron discussed the matter. Patricia Boystak spoke and asked the Board to consider adoption of the resolution. Chairman Simons thanked them for their presentation and said he understood more clearly what they were seeking and advised them the Board would discuss it and take it up at the next meeting.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

BEACH PERSONNEL:

Mrs. Rose asked the Supervisors to set an hourly rate for Catherine Slate, a returning lifeguard at the beach. On a motion by Mr. Coutts, seconded by Mr. Ehrhardt and unanimously carried the hourly rate was set at \$10.75.

COUNTY PLANNING APPOINTMENT:

Mrs. Rose advised Mike Mrorinski, Pike County Planning, has asked that the Supervisors appoint someone to the County Planning Commission to fill Jim Trunzo's unexpired term. The Supervisors discussed the matter and asked Mrs. Rose to see if Dave Zeiler would be interested in serving on that board.

SEO'S REPORT:

SEO Martin was not in attendance but submitted his activity report for the month June in writing. He had no issues for the Board.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Waldron reported on the following:

IRISH ZONING VIOLATION:

Solicitor Waldron advised a new hearing date has been scheduled on the George and Sandra Irish zoning violation matter. Mr. Irish had been successfully served and the Judge scheduled the hearing for August 5, 2020 at 1:30 PM.

TANGLWOOD – WOODMONT PROPERTY

Attorney Waldron, representing Lake Region Development VI, former Tanglwood Woodmont property, shared with the Supervisors a proposed plan his clients have for expansion. His client would like to build four additional cottages at the site. Attorney Waldron said his client has an engineer working on the sewage aspect of the project with the intention of building a system on the non-lake side of Route 507. The Supervisors looked at the sketch plan and agreed that the sewage would need to be addressed for the project to move forward.

WALLENPAUPACK VENTURES, LLC

Chairman Simons asked Mrs. Rose if she knew why the building permit had not been issued for the Wallenpaupack Ventures project. She said the plans were with Shawn McGlynn and she would check on it the next day to see what is holding up the issuance of the permit.

EXECUTIVE SESSION:

The Board at 7:40 PM went to Executive Session to discuss personnel issues.

The Board reconvened their regular meeting at 8:00 PM and there being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 8:10 PM.
